Mission Spotlight: Medical Mission to Nandaine, Nicaragua

Greg Glover and **Debbie** (daughter of **Betty Metzger**) and their two daughters traveled to Nicaragua on a medical missions trip this summer. We helped sponsor them. Greg is a Physician's Assistant and Debbie is a Registered Nurse.

The following results have been logged from that mission:

- 101 Christian medical professionals on the trip.
- 2243 patients seen
- 7405 prescriptions written
- 197 people received dental care
- 2033 people instructed in proper hygiene
- 2240 people received food and/or clothing

A gospel meeting was held, with **641** adults, **578** children in attendance. **Twenty** people were baptized and **131** Bible studies were held.

Last year, twenty people were baptized during the mission trip to another city and it has been determined that nineteen of them are still active and faithful.
