It involved a fifty-year-old-man (who was a public school teacher) and a fifteen-year-old girl (a student at the school) from Tennessee. The media reported how the teacher persuaded the young girl to go with him, apparently because of his physical attraction to her. They were finally found in California last week and were taken back to Tennessee—she, to be reunited with her family and he, to face charges. Amidst all the things be said about the case and the sensational details of it, the man who would prosecute the charges against the former teacher said, "...at the end of the day, she is still a fifteen-year-old girl." Those remarks reminded everyone of the seriousness of the charges, and the consequences that face the man if he is found guilty of those charges.

A young lady's life has been altered because of this older man and the mental harm done to her is difficult to estimate. He has damaged his wife and their marriage. He could very possibly spend the rest of his life marked as a sex offender, with restrictions and limitations that will be heavy burdens to bear.

The reaction of people within America has been generally negative toward the man, in regard to his actions. However, the same society that would condemn him and his actions defends a number of sexual choices by individuals, and those choices seem to increase almost every day. However, at the end of the day, sexual sin is still sin, no matter who commits it or defends it.

Concerning the Gentiles of the first century, Paul said, "Therefore God gave them up in the lust of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves . . . And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done" (Romans 1:24, 28 ESV).

At the end of the day, sin is still sin. And there is coming a day when God will hold all sinners accountable for their sins. (2 Corinthians 5:10).

Four Steps to Overcome Loss

We all experience certain losses in our lives. It may be a job loss or the death of a loved one or even a disability that takes away an enjoyable hobby. All of them inject hurt into our lives that can lead to periods of deep discouragement or depression.

Along with his excellent work with teens, Lonnie Jones is a Licensed Professional Counselor who has been in private practice for 19 years. In a recent article in the magazine known as **Think**, Lonnie shared four steps to overcoming grief. Whether this process takes weeks, months or years, it can prove successful with all losses.

- **#1** Accept the reality: Denial prevents true healing, because it keeps us from facing essential facts. It is futile to relive the events associated with our loss and hope for a different outcome.
- **#2** Express and experience the real emotions: Each person feels loss in different ways. Dominant emotions include deep sadness, uncontrollable fear, raging anger, or profound loneliness. As painful as these feelings are, healing demands confronting them with tears and shouts.
- **#3** Adjust to the new norm: When a close friend moves or our house burns, things will never be the same again. Losses change our schedules, sleeping arrangements, and financial security. We may not need to like the changes, but we need to adjust to them.
- **#4** Reinvest: Changes that we make are not designed to replace what was lost or to make us forget the past. New jobs, friends, ministries, and hobbies simply allow our energies to be reinvested constructively.
